Annapolis, Giant City is a kaleidoscopic portrait of residents and their urban district and analyses its design history. It is a film in which architecture and urban design are directly related to the people who live in it - about the unpredictability of life and the city... About being constantly moving but not always knowing in which direction. Antwerp Left Bank is a neighbourhood on the other side of the river. Defined by highways and river, this place has long been the chosen piece of land for project developers, politicians and architects. Filling a blank sheet of paper with lines, imagining an entire city, building and filling with people: the ultimate dream. A Belgian compromise was implemented and made Linkeroever a mix of concrete in height, asphalt in width and a beach with a view of the harbour and industry. A new generation of architects is once again exploring Linkeroever.

In the film, the Left Bank gets a voice and a character. The inhabitants bring her to life with their imagination. From then on, the city district is an old woman and tells her story herself. The physical city symbolises her body - the tunnels, her veins, the escalator, her heart, the people the blood.


