Original title: Barber Shop

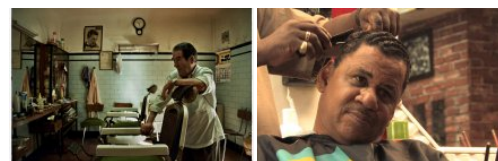

Barber Shop measures the state of our world, offering dialogue and human resilience as a hopeful perspective for the future.
